

(Observer News) at the beginning of this month, Wuhan police investigated and punished 8 people for spreading false information about pneumonia among Internet users. With the development of the epidemic, more and more attention has been paid to the situation of these eight people.

On January 21, Hu Xijin, the editor in chief of the global times, revealed through a micro blog that the public security department had invited the eight citizens to investigate at that time. The process was friendly and polite, and no one was detained or punished. People in Wuhan explained to him that at that time, most people did not expect that the epidemic would develop so severely later, and the stability of social mood was the official priority at that time.

On January 1, Wuhan Municipal Public Security Bureau's official microblog @ Ping An Wuhan posted that it had recently found many cases of pneumonia in Wuhan, and the municipal health and Health Commission issued a notice on this. However, some netizens publish and forward false information on the Internet without verification, resulting in adverse social impact. After investigation and verification, the public security organ has summoned 8 illegal persons and dealt with them according to law.
